








Year 6 Curriculum Overview – Summer 2

<p>English: This half-term Year 6 will extend their range of writing to include non-fiction. We will begin by writing a non-chronological report on an endangered species. We will plan and organise our ideas for writing using subheadings and bullet points. We will use scientific vocabulary and precise formal language to sound like expert conservationists!</p> 	<p>PE: We will be developing skills in athletics. Correct P.E. kit is needed on Mondays. We will be outside whenever possible, so make sure you are ready for the weather!</p> 
<p>Maths: Statistics We will solve problems involving percentages, such as finding 15% of 360. We will use percentages for comparison. We will interpret and construct pie charts. We will learn how to calculate and use the mean as an average.</p> 	<p>History: Making Our Mark We will study types of protest, their impact and key people who have made their mark, including the Suffragettes, The Civil Rights Movement and the Windrush Generation.</p> 
<p>Science: Our science topic this half term is Electricity and Circuits.
