








Learning Blog – 4 Woodpecker

Recently we have been learning about French food and how to ask and pay for it. We had a French picnic on the field, used French phrases and tried croissants, pan au chocolat and sausage.





This week, we enjoyed a trip to Hunter's yard to experience sailing. The children were able to explore a Wherry boat, watch a mast being raised, try to pull a 25lb weight using ropes, made a rope knot keyring and learnt to control the jib on the boat.

The children also learnt about the parts of a boat and the reason for a boat being able to float. A great experience for all (see article and pictures below).

Woodpeckers visited the residents at Harker House and played Curling, which was great fun. The children were well behaved, respectful and brightened the day for those at Harker House.











Year 4 Sailing Trip

On Monday, Kingfisher and Woodpecker classes (Y4) visited Hunters Yard, on the Norfolk Broads in Ludham, North Norfolk. Whilst there, the children were treated to a morning/afternoon of sailing. On board their small sailing vessels, skippered by some fantastic volunteers from the community, the children learnt how to sail, taking responsibility for tacking the sails, using the tiller to steer the boats and the occasional rescue mission to escape from an unplanned visit into the reeds! After the sailing and a picturesque picnic by the broads, children were lucky enough to board a working Wherry boat, dating back to 1888! The former haulage boat, has since been converted and children were told about its fascinating history before returning back to the yard for some science-based workshop fun. It was a memorable day out for the pupils, thank you to parent volunteers, Mr Manson and Mr & Mrs Bulldeath, who kindly gave up their time to support the trip.
